**NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING**  
**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE DES MOINES MUNICIPAL CODE**

Notice is hereby given that the Des Moines City Council will conduct a public hearing on May 9, 2019 at 7:00 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the matters may be heard, in the City Council Chambers located at 21630 11th Avenue South, Des Moines, WA 98198 to consider Draft Ordinance 19-048 related to land use, amending the use table in DMMC 18.52.010B and adding and revising definitions in DMMC 18.01.050.

Background: On March 14, 2019 the Des Moines City Council adopted Ordinance 1714 adopting interim regulations amending the use table in DMMC 18.52.010B and adding and revising definitions in DMMC 18.01.050, declaring an emergency and setting a hearing date. As interim regulations, a public hearing is required within 60 days of adoption. After the close of the public hearing, the City Council will adopt findings of fact on the subject of this interim control regulation and either justify its continued imposition or rescind the regulation.
