





## **Notice of Determination of Nonsignificance**

Notice is hereby given that the City of Des Moines Responsible SEPA Official has determined that the following described proposal is not anticipated to create significant adverse environmental impacts and will not require preparation of an environmental impact statement.

PROPOSAL:	The City of Des Moines Marina is proposing maintenance dredging at the entrance channel to the marina. The proposed Project will remove approximately 7,500 cubic yards of accumulated sediment from previously dredged and authorized locations. Maintenance dredging is proposed to the authorized depth of -13 feet mean lower low water plus 2 feet of overdredge allowance. The dredged material will be disposed of at an approved openwater disposal site or approved upland facility. Applications for a grading permit, a shoreline substantial development permit exemption, and SEPA review have been submitted.

Comments should discuss specific environmental issues associated with this proposal and identify how the DNS does or does not address those issues.

The decision to issue the DNS may be appealed by filing an appeal consistent with Sections 16.05.300 and 18.240.170, if applicable, of the Des Moines Municipal Code. Appeals must be complete and filed with the City Clerk by 4:30 p.m., on <u>December 2, 2019</u>. The appeal letter must cite specific procedural errors, omissions, environmental impacts, inaccurate environmental information or failure to comply with specific adopted policies or codes which dispute the validity of the DNS.
